Mrs Molloy (previously Miss Frew) will be with us once a fortnight as part of a small amount of additionality staffing. This session, this was previously covered by Mrs Aitken. This additionality allows up to carry our assessments, provide focused support etc. The children are delighted to see welcome her back.

Welcome to new families We have two children join Room 1 recently, welcome to you and your family.

Road closure From Monday 29th January, for up to 5 days (weather dependant), the main road from Carstairs Village into Carstairs Junction will be closed. The closure will be from the junction of East End Terrace in Carstairs Village to the junction of Woodside Street in Carstairs Junction. The diverted route will be signposted via The Westend.

School Improvement Plan: Update

- 1.All stakeholders will continue to focus on curriculum development; contributing to the school rationale with a focus on the four contexts of learning. Further support the needs of all learners through whole staff professional development on 'Attention Autism'.
 - Progress: Impact to date has been very positive with pupils building up their attention & communication skills. Mrs Palmer is incorporating this approach to other aspects of the day e.g. phonics & interdisciplinary learning.
- 2. Provide high quality learning & teaching experiences in writing through use of learning intentions and success criteria. Talking and listening opportunities to be used as a vehicle to raise attainment in writing.
 - o Progress: Mrs Simpson, our Literacy Co-ordinator led a session with teachers this month, with a focus on using a range of model texts to engage learners.
- 3. Further develop Play based learning pedagogy at Early level and introduce play based principles to First & Second level. Pupil progress and skills progression will be tracked and monitored through play experiences. Increased opportunities for high quality teaching & assessment in Science technology Engineering & Maths (STEM).
 - Progress: Skills for life are tracked and monitored in ELC and in most classes using Skills framework. We look forward to sharing our class floor books with you at Parent Consultation and our class showcases.
 - Progress: All STEM resources have now been audited and our next priority is to purchase resources in line with South Lanarkshire Planning Science & STEM planning.
- 4. Equity: Provide targeted support in Numeracy with identified individuals and groups.
 - Progress: Four teachers are embarking on Maths Recovery professional learning to provide targeted support in Numeracy with identified individuals and groups and to provide a firm foundation of maths knowledge.
 - Progress: Pupils are supported in small groups and on a 1.1 through focused maths intervention (using Maths Recovery approach)..

Parents Portal Live Items Just a reminder that the calendar on Parents Portal has the lunch menu for each day and any events that are happening within the school. Parents Portal will also be our first point of contact for any important information so please check this regularly.

Grab Rail Just a reminder that we have our 'grab rail' just inside the 'bubble' at the main foyer with uniform in very good condition. You are welcome and encouraged to come and take any uniform items.

Similarly, if you have any uniform items your child outgrown, if these are in very good condition, can you please hand in to the office. We would particularly appreciate girls leggings of all sizes.

Reminder of Adverse Weather If it is snowing in the morning and the ground is covered our janitor, will make every effort to ensure a path is available to the door nearest the main school gate.

Whilst it is rare for the school to be closed due to adverse weather, in the event of an ELC or School closure or delayed start, Parents Portal (School) and Learning Journals (ELC) will be our first and main method of communicating updates to families. Purchase of Bikes for benefit of the chidren We are in the process of ordering bikes for the benefit of our senior children. This has only been possible through external funding. We aim to buy bikes for now for the more senior pupils so they have the opportunity to access Bikeability and learn cycling skills. Lots more information to follow!

Once we have these bikes it is essential we keep them in good order. We have teamed up with 'Gear Up', part of Healthy Valleys and they have offered to provide

training to any volunteer parents/carers/staff on basic bike maintenance. It is anticipated we will be able to purchase around 16 brand new bikes but as you'll appreciate these will take a bit of time to check and maintain.

Ms Martin, our P6/7 class teacher is currently trained in leading this but we welcome and need support from our school community. If we can secure 6+ volunteers from

across the ELC/school to take part in the Bikeability training, it could be delivered here at Carstairs Junction. It is usually only held at Chatelherault in Hamilton. Again, please contact the school office if you can offer your support. The initial training is likely to be two half day sessions.**
